3. All exhibits must be checked in by 11:00 am on Wednesday, September 5, 2018. No late exhibits will be accepted.
4. **Entries must be appropriate for all audiences.**
5. Exhibits entered in the wrong class will be corrected by fair officials before judging.
6. At the discretion of the superintendent and/or judge, any item may be removed from this section due to over maturity or other defects.
7. Vegetables that spoil while on display will be disposed of at the discretion of the superintendent.
